









1st International Symposium on Social Identity and Loneliness: Community-based approaches to loneliness reduction

In this, the inaugural symposium of the International Centre for Community-based Loneliness Prevention (ICCLP), we bring together academics from Japan, Australia and the UK with local stakeholders and practitioners in Nottingham/shire to set out an agenda for future research on tackling loneliness at local community level. Contributors will outline the current gaps in knowledge, propose new ways of understanding loneliness and demonstrate how current community-based initiatives and interventions help integrate and empower those suffering from loneliness. The outcome of the meeting will be to establish a broad consortium of academics and external partners to develop a series of proposals for the next generation of loneliness-reduction research.
