Last Friday, Shane, Sarah Learmonth, Rob Cook and myself attended a meeting at Frankston High to progress plans for the launch of an Interact Club at Frankston High.

The school has clearly embraced this initiative and it was exciting to hear that they have already progressed their thoughts on how the Club will be integrated into the School's broader student leadership program. They have already obtained enthusiastic support from key Senior School students who will lead the launch of the club and the recruitment of a broader membership base across the year groups.

This week, the leadership students are attending a camp at which time the planning for Interact will continue at a school level, while we (Rotary and Rotaract) work on what we need to do behind the scenes, ahead of the launch.

The Club will be formally announced and promoted at a series of School Assemblies on March 13 and we at this stage expect the first Interact Club meeting to be held at the beginning of Term 2 (April).

Our role (Rotary & Rotaract) is to guide and mentor the Club, not to run it. The students will run the club and decide the service projects they undertake. With more than 20k Interact Clubs and 450k Interactors around the world, it is great to be bringing this project to Frankston High.

After seeing first hand at Friday's meeting the enthusiasm and commitment of the school to get behind Interact, it is impossible not to be excited about what lies ahead.
