Museums

Hudson River Maritime Museum

Kingston, NY; it focuses on the maritime history of the Hudson River

New York State Museum

Albany, NY; it offers exhibits on the natural and cultural history of the Hudson Valley

The American Museum of Natural History

New York, NY; exhibits on the natural history and environmental aspects of the Hudson Valley, which provide context for understanding the landscapes depicted by Hudson River School artists

Hudson River Museum

Yonkers, NY; cultural institution with a collection including prominent works from the Hudson River School of painting, to pieces of contemporary art in addition to a period room, planetarium, and environmental teaching gallery

Historic Sites

Olana State Historic Site - The home of artist Frederic Edwin Church, showcasing his art and the unique Persian-inspired architecture of his estate.

Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site - A grand estate built by Frederick William Vanderbilt, reflecting the opulence of the Gilded Age and offering tours of the mansion and gardens.

Hyde Park Historic Sites - Includes the Franklin D. Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum, the Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site, and the Vanderbilt Mansion.

Kykuit, the Rockefeller Estate - The former estate of the Rockefeller family, featuring impressive gardens, art collections, and historic buildings.

Washington's Headquarters State Historic Site - The site where George Washington established his headquarters during the American Revolution, located in Newburgh.

<u>Sleepy Hollow Cemetery</u> - Famous for its association with Washington Irving's "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" and as the final resting place of notable figures such as Andrew Carnegie and Elizabeth Arden.

The Staatsburgh State Historic Site (Mills Mansion) - A grand estate of the Gilded Age, offering a glimpse into the lives of the wealthy families of the era.

<u>The Hudson-Athens Lighthouse</u> - A historic lighthouse located in the Hudson River, which has been guiding ships since the 19th century.

<u>The Thomas Cole National Historic Site</u> - The home and studio of artist Thomas Cole, founder of the Hudson River School of landscape painting.

<u>Montgomery Place</u> - A historic estate with beautifully preserved architecture and gardens, offering insight into 19th-century life and landscape design.

<u>Boscobel House and Gardens</u> - An 1804 Federal-style mansion with gardens overlooking the Hudson River, offering tours and cultural events.

<u>The Reformed Church of New Paltz</u> - A historic church associated with the Huguenot settlers, featuring a rich history and early American architecture.
