The Gunning Arts Festival today launched a short story writing project FlashWrite - highlighting who we are.

The Festival Committee are inviting submissions of stories of up to 1500 words that encapsulate local life experiences. Stories related to the 2021 Festival theme "Rejuvenation" are especially welcome.

A selection of the stories will be published online in the lead up to the 2021 Gunning Arts Festival and some will be selected to be performed and published in a booklet to be printed as part of the Festival.

Submissions are welcome any time until 8 February 2021 and can be lodged electronically or in hardcopy.
