Bruce Mitchell Pain and Tiahn Summers - Clinic medicinal cannabis

Dr. Bruce Mitchell and Tiarna talked about treatment of chronic pain and other ailments with medical cannabis. The doctor said that the results of this new treatment are extremely encouraging but there is still a lot of research to be done to properly understand how cannabis as a treatment works in the body.




