HOW DO I SURVIVE MY TIME AS A STUDENT?

FIRST YEAR WEEKEND, OWEE AND (MANDITORY) INTRODUCTION PERIOD ASSOCIATIONS

Your student life is about to begin! But what is waiting for you? There are several events taking place before the start of your studies that will make you feel completely at home in Delft. There is a First Year Weekend of your study, the OWee for all prospective students in Delft and an introduction period for those who want to join an association.

But which events are of interest to you? What is the difference between a First Year Weekend and the OWee, the introduction period for al students? What do you need to know before coming to Delft and where to find all the information? In this part(and further in this BINAS) we will give some information on how the beginning of your student time in Delft will be golden!

First year weekend (EJW)

All study associations (the one affiliated with your study) organize a freshmen weekend, or EJW, for all its upcoming first year students. This is a fun and enjoyable weekend where you get to know your fellow students by doing different activities, which will allow you to sit together in the lecture halls and study together. This weekend generally takes place before the OWee. Keep an eye on the socials of your study association. Want to know more about study associations? Check out chapter 6 of this Binas: Study associations!

Introduction Week (OWee)

AftertheFirstYearWeekend,theOWeetakes place. The OWee is the Reception Week of Delft, as you may have read before. During this reception week you and your OWee group, which often comes over from the FirstYearWeekend, explore the city of Delft. You get to know all the associations that Delft has and you make the city your own.

During the OWee you get to know your golden buddies and make Delft your place!

Getting to know time (KMT) & open training/rehearsals

If you join one of Delft's many associations, chances are that after the OWee you will have to keep a few days or evenings free for the KennisMakingsTijd (KMT) or open trainings/repetitions of this association. The length of the KMTs and the dates vary by association. The associations will take your studies into account and provide you with a place to sleep in Delft if it is a multi-day event. For the exact dates, keep an eye on the socials of the respective association, and ask for information about it during the OWee!

What is the use of the BINAS?

The BINAS, the booklet you are browsing now, contains all the information about becoming a student in Delft that you need to make a golden start. We recommend that you browse through all study and student associations, student initiatives and places of interest to get a feel for what Delft has to offer! That way you know what you are interested in and which places you might want to visit during the OWee.

During the OntvangstWeek the whole of Delft is upside down and all new students walk through the city. Of course you are not alone: with nine future fellow students and two senior year mentors you will explore Delft and its student life. Together with them you will get to know Delft, follow the OWee program and experience a golden week!

Program

During the OWee, each day will feature a different aspect of student life. The day program is provided by the OWee Board. In the evening you can eat at the associations before the evening program breaks loose. Each association organizes different activities, There is something for everyone! Here is an impression of what this year's OWee program will look like.

BEFORE THE OWee

August 7th: Online Opening

Before the physical OWee, there will be an online opening. There will be several activities, such as a talk show and the Associations Forum where associations will tell you what they stand for. After this, you are well prepared to follow the OWee program!

First Years Weekend

Just before the OWee are the First Year Weekends. Your study association organizes a weekend where you can get to know your fellow students. For more information check the website of your study association or read the BINAS! You can register for the First Year Weekend at www.owee.nl.

MONDAY JUNE 12TH

ALCOHOL POLICY

Many of you are already 18 years old and therefore old enough to buy and consume alcohol. However, another part is not yet 18 years old and is therefore not allowed to buy and drink alcohol. Alcohol is inextricably linked to student culture. In Delft, this takes place largely outside the regular catering industry, within study and student associations, student houses and student events. In mid-2018, a collaboration was started between five student

associations, the Youth and Alcohol Foundation,

Red Cross Delft and Midden-Delfland, the Municipality of Delft and TU Delft. The reason for this was the observation that alcohol use among students deserves more attention.

This is because regular (excessive) use of alcohol by students who are often still young causes significant health risks. In addition, it can lead to adverse consequences for their environment in the form of nuisance and physical damage, effect on study results, but also damage to the image of students in general. In addition, drinking alcohol is not a 'must'! For example, at all events where the OWee offers drinks, you will also be able to buy 0.0 drinks and soft drinks in addition to alcoholic drinks. There will also be events where no alcohol is served.

0.0Wee, 100% OKee.

During the OWee the following house rules apply:

- 1. Alcohol will not be served to anyone under the age of 18. Those under 18 will be given a different wristband to those aged 18 or over. You cannot take part in any Introduction Week event, including the evening programme, unless you are wearing a wristband. This will be checked at all events and student clubs.
- 2. You should always have a valid ID card on you during Introduction Week activities and at the evening events even if you are over 18.
- 3. Any Introduction Week participant under the age of 18 caught consuming alcohol will be immediately removed from the activities/evening programme and their wristband will be confiscated.
- 4. A note will be made of the name of the Introduction Week participant in question. A decision will then be taken on whether the person in question can buy back their wristband.
- 5. It is not permitted to pass on alcoholic drinks to underage participants. Any breach of this rule will result in both parties having their wristbands confiscated on the spot. They will then no longer be able to take part.
- 6. Participants may not bring their own alcoholic drinks to Introduction Week events.
- 7. There will be a zero tolerance policy towards underage drinking and the use of drugs during the 2023 Introduction Week.
- 8. It is not permitted to use drugs, including laughing gas, during the Introduction Week



SUSTAINABILITY

What we do

Each year, the OWee Board aims to create the most sustainable Introduction Week possible. This involves making big but also small changes, all of which contribute to reducing the carbon footprint we leave behind after the OWee. For example, this BINAS has been reduced by almost 100 pages in recent years. This saves us about 900 kilograms of paper!

In recent years, at every event organized, we have done our best to separate the waste streams as much as possible. For this we also ask for your help! Together we can make sure that the waste of thousands of new students ends up in the right place as much as possible. Throw your waste in the right bin during and after the OWee!

In addition to the above points, we have other spearheads regarding sustainability. Here are some of them:

- Quality items left over from previous OWee editions will not be thrown away. We donate usable items such as shirts, bags and waterbottles to organizations that distribute them to schools abroad that desperately need them. Leftover food will be given to the 'Voedselbank'; a place where people with less budget for food can pick it up!



- At our events, we use plastic hard cups whenever possible. This way, the cups can be used multiple times, which means much less plastic needs to be used! So don't forget to return your cup after an event.
- The OWee has many sponsors each year. This year we are encouraging our sponsors to choose more environmentally friendly flyers. These flyers are printed on growth paper: this is biodegradable paper and contains flower seeds!
- During the OWee, participants will receive gadgets. This year we are going to investigate sustainable options, and will choose to use them if possible.
- o During the OWee, all meals included in the registration fee are vegetarian. With this action we want to create more awareness among both participants and mentors!




What can you do?

HEALTH

Student Health Care

When you start living in Delft, it is wise to register with a family doctor in Delft. It often takes a lot of time to travel to your old family doctor. When you register with a family doctor in Delft you can always easily go somewhere with your complaints.

You can also register with the Student Health Care (SGZ). This organization is committed to student health. The student practice of the SGZ is a regular general practice. You can register online at www. sgzstudent.nl or at the practice itself, for and consultation hours by appointment.

Regular health care

Besides the student practice there are many other general practitioner practices in Delft. To get a good overview of the different practices, you can visit the website: www.zorgkaartnederland.nl/huisarts/delft consult. Have you found a good practice? Then contact them if there is still room, as they are quite often full!

Health insurance

It is required by law to have basic health insurance. You can also opt for a supplementary insurance. The costs and services vary by insurer. With the care allowance, you can often pay for most of your basic insurance.

Emergency

If there is an emergency, you can go to the Reinier de Graaf Gasthuis's general practitioner's clinic. Please note: the general practitioners' clinic is only for emergencies outside the opening hours of your own general practice. And only for emergencies that really can't wait until the next day. Do you have an emergency? Then you can call for advice or an appointment. Always call 015-251 1930 before you go to the doctor's office!

Pharmacies Delft

When your doctor prescribes your medication, it is prepared for you at a pharmacy of your choice. choice. You can choose a pharmacy that is conveniently located for you. If you need medication urgently in the evening, at night, on weekends or during holidays, you can go to the service pharmacy at the Reinier de Graaf hospital. This pharmacy is open outside the normal opening hours of your own pharmacy. To find out more, go to www.dienstapotheekdelft.nl.

GESCHIEDENIS

History

In the coming years, the city of Delft will be your city. A city that has a rich history and has been a residence of many important people. It is definitely worth knowing a little more about the city.

The roots

Around the vear discovered that swampy becomes drier when a ditch is dug. This digging is also called delving. The English word for dug is "delved," from which Delft gets its name. In the place where Delft now lies, a ditch was dug and a settlement arose. A hundred years later, the village grew so large that a new ditch was needed: the Nieuwe Delft. Delft became an important market center, which can still be seen by the size of the central market square. In 1246, Delft received city rights from the Dutch Count William II.

The Middle Ages

During the Middle Ages, Delft experienced difficult periods; in the 14th century, Delft was besieged and in 1536 a fierce fire reduced the entire city to ashes. The greatest disaster was the "Delft Thunderclap." In 1654 the powder cellar exploded where the

Paardenmarkt is now located. 200 houses were in ruins and 300 were badly damaged. In the 16th century, William of Orange came to live in Delft. "I cannot approve of sovereigns wanting to rule over the conscience of their subjects and deprive them of freedom of faith and religion" is one of his winged statements. This was the cause of his conflict with Phillips II and the beginning of the Eighty Years' War. In 1580 William of Orange was banished by Phillips II and in 1584 at the Prinsenhof in Delft he was assassinated by Balthazar Gerards.

17th century

This century saw an economic boom in Delft, partly due to the presence of the Dutch East India Company and the trade in porcelain, the Delft Blue. Due to a war in China, Chinese porcelain could no longer be supplied and Delft gained a monopoly on the porcelain market. This was also the time of one of the greatest painters of the Golden Age, "Johannes Vermeer." This great painter was born in Delft in 1632 and lived there all his life.





HISTORY

Decline

From the disaster year of 1672, where England, France, Cologne and Munster invaded the Dutch Republic, Delft also suffered an economic decline. Since that time, Delft became overshadowed by the cities of The Hague (government city) and Rotterdam (port city).

City of knowlegde

In 1842, a strong need for technically skilled people arose in the Netherlands, so the Royal Academy of Civil Engineers was founded in Delft. This academy was the forerunner of today's Delft University of Technology and offered courses in mechanical, civil and mining engineering. As a result, Delft grew into a thriving student city.

But Delft's history as a city of knowledge goes back much further. One of the most famous figures in Delft's history is Anthonie van Leeuwenhoek, a famous scientist who lived and worked in Delft in the 17th century. Van Leeuwenhoek is best known for his discoveries in the field of microbiology. Using microscopes he built himself, he discovered countless new microorganisms, laying the foundation for modern microbiology. His work had a great influence on the development of science and is still studied and appreciated today.





With the establishment of TNO in 1932 and other knowledge-intensive institutes and companies, Delft transformed from a City of Culture and Princes into a City of Knowledge. Delft has since developed into a major player in the field of technology and innovation, and is a place where major scientific discoveries are made. Delft University of Technology plays an important role in this, but other knowledge institutions and companies are also of great importance to the development of the city.

With a rich history in science and innovation, and a vibrant student culture, Delft remains a city where knowledge is highly valued and new ideas are born. It is a city that is still in full swing and where the future is full of opportunities and possibilities.

STUDENT HOUSING

You come to study in Delft, but you are not the only one looking for a room. In this chapter you will find useful tips for finding a home!

Make sure to arrange your accommodation before arriving in the Netherlands, as you are officially required to register a valid Dutch address within 5 days after arrival in the Netherlands. Registering a valid Dutch address at the local municipality is a legal obligation for all who intend to stay in the Netherlands for 4 months or more, irrespective of nationality or purpose of stay. A valid and registered address allows you to obtain a BSN (Citizen Service Number), which is needed to interact with Dutch authorities.

TU Delft suggests three ways to arrange accommodation. See below for information on each of these options.

Finding accommoddation thourough rental agencies or private landlords

Prioritize finding accommodation once you know that you will attend TU Delft. Finding a room in Delft can be difficult and time-consuming. As most university cities in the Netherlands, Delft has a shortage of affordable student accommodations. The following information may prove to be useful

when looking for accommodation:

- Delft is a relatively small city, therefore neighbouring m unicipalities can provide good alternatives within
- reasonable travel distance from TU Delft's campus.
- \cdot Groups on Facebook could aid the search for

accommodation; e.g. "Find a room(mate) in Delft" & "Find an international roommate in Delft"

Keep the following in mind when looking for

accommodation:

- There are fewer (affordable) accommodations available, in the months leading up to the
- Most accommodations on offer are unfurnished and rent often does not included utilities and municipal taxes.
- Make sure the owner provides you with a declaration of permission to register the address with the municipality.
- · Read the rental agreement carefully.
- · Be aware of rental frauds.

Lodging with family, friends, and other acquaintances

Moving in with someone? Make sure to have permission from the primary resident as well as the owner of the residence to register the address with the municipality, for which you can use this authorisation form. Fill in the authorisation form and have it signed by the primary resident and the owner of the residence. Bring the form with the necessary documents, as mentioned in the form, to your registration with the municipality.

Additionally, register your Dutch address as soon as possible in Studielink.

TU Delft has partnered with various housing agencies in the greater-Delft region to offer accommodation to students coming from abroad. Accommodations will become available prior to the start of each semester and can only be reserved through TU Delft's housing portal.

Students & City

Delft, the Golden Ratio. A city of versatility, different people from different backgrounds, education levels and cultures together in 24 square kilometers. But how do you fit in as a student? Delft is known as a real student city, 19% of all residents in all of Delft are students. This gives Delft the third highest percentage of student households in the Netherlands, according to CBS. Although there are many of us as students, students are just as much residents of the city of Delft as non-students! Delft is your city, your home. As inhabitants of Delft, we are all responsible for maintaining our nice, pleasant and clean city!

Living in Delft

As a prospective student, you may be looking for a new place to live in Delft, perhaps a student house. Once you have succeeded, you register with the Municipality of Delft, and you are officially a resident of Delft. Delft has many student houses throughout the city, from the inner city to the suburbs. However, because of the 'Verkamersings'-law, new student houses cannot be added just like that. This has to do with the number of students in the city centre; the law ensures that the ratio of students to non-students remains in a golden balance.

Minimalise nuisance

But as a resident of Delft, how do you contribute to maintaining the atmosphere and bond between residents of the city? Very easy, think of your fellow man! Here are some basic tips on how you can reduce nuisance:

- Be quiet on the streets at night, as well as in the garden! If you want to call family during the night because they are in another time zone, do so indoors! That way everyone will get a good night's sleep.
- Park your bike in the designated spaces.
 This way everyone can get around normally
- Throw your trash in the garbage cans on the street. This is not only good for the city, but also for the environment!



Associations

During the OWee you will see that a number of associations have their buildings in or around the city center, or near residential areas. Some of these associations have made agreements with their neighbors about, for example, the volume of music during parties or the parking of bikes on the street. They have done this because residents and associations are often close together, especially in the city center. So if you are passing through here at night during the OWee, it is extra important that you pay attention to your fellows! Park your bike in a place where it won't bother anyone and talk softly when you walk out the door at an association; during and after the OWee!

Your input

It's important to understand that your actions can affect residents.

So, what can you do to bond with local people? Firstly, you can get involved in volunteering work. It's a great way to help the community and meet new people at the same time. For example; distribute soup to the elderly. Next to that, it's fun to attend local events. Whether it's festivals, sporting events or markets, you can have a lot of fun while getting to know the city and its people.

And let's not forget to shop at local stores and restaurants. Not only does it support the local economy, but it can also lead to a good relationship with the owners and employees of these businesses.

It is important to treat your environment and your fellow human beings respectfully and responsibly. Stick to the rules and Delft and its people will welcome you with open arms!

Everything you need to know before coming to the Netherlands!

VISA application

In order to be able to study in the Netherlands, you may need to apply for a MVV VISA (entry VISA) and/or a Residence Permit for Study. TU Delft will apply for these VISAs at the IND on your behalf. The IND is the Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Services. It is not possible for you as a student to apply yourself. If you hold the nationality of the EU or EFTA, you don't need to a VISA and/or residence permit.

In order to apply for your MVV VISA and/or Residence Permit for Study, you need to fullfil the following conditions:

- You have been (conditionally) admitted to the TU Delft as a student.
- You are able to demonstrate your financial solvability (i.e. tuition fee and/or costs of living)

Registration with the municipality

If you are coming to live in Delft for a longer period than 4 months, you need to register within the municipality of Delft within 5 days of your arrival. To do so, you need to gather the right documents. These are:

- Permanent residence address
- A passport
- A copy of your MVV
- A proof of enrolment with the TU Delft

With these documents, you can make an appointment with the municipality, which you can do by calling the number 14015. After you've had your appointment, you will get a confirmation and you'll receive your Citizen Service Number (BSN in Dutch). This number is important for other services in the Netherlands.

Dutch bank account

If you already have a bank account with an IBANnumber and it's registered in a SEPA country, you could keep your bank account. However, it's still smart to have a Dutch account, because your bank may charge you extra costs and some services in the Netherlands are only accessible with Dutch bank accounts. With your BSN, you can get a free bank account at quite a lot of banks. Some of the Dutch banks are: ASN bank, ABN Amro bank, SNS bank, ING bank and Rabobank

Health insurance

TU Delft advises all students to have sufficient medical insurance and personal liability insurance. It is your own responsibility to be sufficiently insured on the date of your departure to the Netherlands.

Sufficient medical insurance (in Dutch "ziektekostenverzekering") covers medical expenses up to the Dutch cost price. The personal liability insurance (in Dutch "aansprakelijkheidverzekering/AVP") is meant to insure you for damage you accidentally cause to someone else.

Which healthcare insurance you need depends on your nationality and whether you have a part time job or paid internship in the Netherlands next to your studies. You can find which health care you need at https://www.tudelft.nl/en/education/practical-matters/insurance-and-healthcare.

Travel by public transport

In the Netherlands, wherever you want to go outside of Delft, public transport will take you there easily. To travel by train, metro, bus or tram you need an OV-chipkaart. For only €7,50 you have a personal card. You must top up your balance on your card in order to travel. Choosing to go to TU Delft is about so uch more than your choice of study. TU Delft offers highquality teaching and an inspiring, fascinating, and attractive study environment that allows you, as a student, to develop into a critical, results oriented, and socially responsible engineer. You will find yourself in an international setting in which everyone is welcome, regardless of sexual orientation, functional impairment, or cultural, political, or religious background. There are more than 125 nationalities at the university, and almost a quarter of all students are from outside the Netherlands.



Welcome!

During your first weeks at TU Delft, you will no doubt have all kinds of questions about your degree programme and everything related to it. From information about enrolment and termination of enrolment, tuition fees, and financial assistance (Profiling Fund) to lecture times and where to find your timetable. To help get you off to a good start, we have posted a range of useful information for you on the welcome.tudelft.nl website. Here, you will find information about the academic calendar and a map of the campus showing where teaching buildings and catering facilities are located, as well as information about the laptop project, study support and all the other amenities available at TU Delft.

Faculties and degree programmes

TU Delft has eight faculties. These are departments at the university that focus on particular subjects and offer Bachelor's and Master's programmes in these subjects.



Study culture and teaching methods

The study culture at TU Delft is ambitious and enterprising. Our students follow a relatively challenging and intensive study programme, by Dutch standards. You need a positive and active attitude to studying and you have to be able to plan and organise your time properly. Studying at TU Delft means a great deal of independence. Are you looking for a good place to study? Then the TU Delft library is the perfect spot. There are more locations with study spots, you can find them at spacefinder.tudelft.nl.

As well as being good at leadership, analytical, and critical, TU Delft students enjoy a reputation for showing initiative and setting up projects. That enterprising character is part and parcel of the makeup of TU Delft students and engineers. As a TU Delft student, you ask yourself not only how something works, but how it could be improved upon; you see a problem in society and find a solution to it.

You will spend much of your time working alone when studying, but you will also learn how to work well in groups. You will carry out many projects as part of a group and experience several different teaching formats during your studies. We strive to

provide as much face-to-face classes as possible. However it is that some teaching will take place online. Depending on your studies some classes will take place in a laboratory.

Structure of Bachelor's degree programme

The academical year has an official opening ceremony. Roughly the year is divided in 4 quarters. You have exams multiple times throughout the year and you are obliged to sign up for the exams yourself. Prior to your exams you occasionally have a 'witte week'; a lecture free week. This week students are provided time to revisit material from the past quarter.

A Bachelor's degree programme lasts three years, as is the case at all other universities. Most of the engineering programmes have lots of theoretical classes that demands lots of knowledge and selfstudy and mathematics like linear algebra, calculus and analytics.



Apart from that you will participate in experimental learning which often takes place in groups. This way you will use your theoretical knowledge in a practical situation. At the end of your first year, you

will be given a binding recommendation on whether or not to continue with your studies.



If you have obtained less than 45 of your 60 credits, you may not continue with the same programme the following year. During your second year you will deepen your knowledge and then choose a minor in your third year. During this half year you can focus on a specific topic within your Bachelor's programme or broaden your horizon. You can choose a minor at another TU Delft faculty or other universities in the Netherlands or even abroad. In other words, you have a lot of freedom in terms of what you do in these six months. We encourage international mobility by offering options for doing part of your programme at another university, in or outside the Netherlands. TU Delft has partnerships with various other universities and international companies, which

makes it easy for you to go on an (online) exchange programme. In your third year you will work on your Bachelor's thesis project (BEP). After completing this project you will receive your Bachelor's degree and you can call yourself a bachelor of science. You will then have the choice of continuing to study or starting work. Following on from your Bachelor's programme, you can take a Master's programme. At universities of technology, they take two years.

Honours Programme

Bachelor's students who are capable of handling more than the regular degree programme and who perform at an above average level can take part in the TU Delft Honours Programme, a challenging supplementary programme in which you carry out research or do projects independently. You can design much of the programme yourself. Together with Honours students from other Bachelor's programmes, you may find yourself working on research for a professor, for example, or writing a business plan, carrying out an assignment for a company, or organising scientific lectures for fellow students More information about HPD can be found at tudelft.nl/en/student/ education/honours-programme.

Activities besides your studies

TU Delft offers various student projects - separate from the degree programmes - that give you the opportunity to further develop your talents. These student projects are also referred to as 'dream teams'. Examples include the Delft Hyperloop and TU Delft Hydro Motion Team. This is a great way to learn, and the experience gained is invaluable for your future career. Do you have ideas to start

your own company of do you want to learn more about entrepreneurship? The Delft Centre for Entrepreneurship develops your entrepreneurial skills met classes, competitions and the start-up night.

Diversity & Inclusion

You can expect TU Delft to allow you to feel at home and safe and to develop yourself, regardless of individual differences. That is why TU Delft pays a lot of attention to accessibility and diversity in education and brings people together in a rich and diverse working and study environment, with equal opportunities for all. Confidential advisers

Before, during and after the OWee, there is a confidential counselor at TU Delft who you can (literally) go to at all times with reports about any nature of maladaptive behavior and/or when you need help yourself

Psychologists

What can you expect from the student psychologists? In addition to courses, the psychologists at TU Delft also offer short-term, individual supervision.



In principle, short-term means that the supervision consists of a maximum of 3 conversations. During the intake, we look at what the student encounters, how this came about and what someone wants to work on. Then, together with the student, a plan is drawn up for the follow-up interviews. Sometimes it becomes apparent during the intake that the student needs long-term supervision or a different specialization than we can offer with the student psychologists. Then we refer the student to the general practitioner for a referral to a psychologist outside the TU.

Study choice advisor

The Study Choice Advisor is specialized in guiding students in their choice of study. You can follow a large number of workshops about study choice, reconsidering study options and finding the right master's degree.



Library (building 21)

TU Delft Library is the largest technical scientific library in the Netherlands. The library selects, manages, processes and supplies information from the Netherlands and abroad that is relevant to all studies at the TU. TU Delft Library is also a great place to study quietly or to collaborate with a project group. The Library Learning Center can be found on Prometheusplein behind the Aula. You can use various types of study places, project rooms and printing facilities here.



Pulse (building 33)

The teaching rooms in Pulse are available for selfstudy outside the scheduled hours. The timetable of the rooms is visible on the screen in the central hall and on the room managers at the rooms. The study places in the corridors are also available for self-study.



The Fellowship (building 66)

The teaching rooms Fellowship Education Building 66 are available for selfstudy outside the scheduled hours. The timetable of the rooms is visible on the screen in the central hall and on the room managers at the rooms.



Echo (building 29)

The sustainable Echo education building has a total of seven teaching rooms, most of which can be flexibly partitioned. In this way three separate rooms can be made out of the largest lecture hall of 700 places. Group work and self-study are possible at the more than 300 study places.



Flu

In the middle of the campus - between Cornelis Drebbelweg, Leeghwaterstraat, Korvezeestraat and Feldmannweg - TU Delft has started construction of the new education building Flux. It is a temporary and demountable building that can be built and reused elsewhere in the future if necessary. Flux is expected to be occupied from Q3 2023 and will offer 20 study places.

Obtaining a master's degree at THUAS

This academic year, our Next Level Engineering master's degree will start in Delft. Something to keep in mind. If you still want more after four years of studying, this master's will allow you to get your MSc title within a year.

Guidance and Support

During the Introduction Day - the first official day of lectures - you will meet the teaching team of your study program and you will meet your study coach.

Learning by practice! During the study programme you will work on company assignments or do research. Sometimes alone, but usually in a project team with other students. Company assignments are carried out under the supervision of a lecturer and the client. So pay close attention to who to contact if you run into problems:

- Can the problem be traced back to a company assignment? Then contact the lecturer.
- o Are you're having trouble with your study planning or a delay in your study progress?

In that case, you should first discuss these problems with your study career counselor. Depending on your situation, you will be referred to the student counselor or the Student Success Centre.

You go to the student counselor:

- o in case of personal circumstances that affect your study.
- if you need extra support beyond what the study coach or the SSC can provide
- if you intend to combine top sport activities while studying at Inholland University of Applied Sciences.
- o for extra support due to a (functional) limitation.



Information about freshmen weekends

What is a freshmen weekend?

A freshmen weekend (EJW) usually takes place in the weekend before the OWee and is organised by your study association. During this weekend, you mainly get to know your study mates. Usually, this weekend you also put together your OWee group with the mates you made during your EJW.

What happens if I can't go to my freshmen weekend?

So what can I do during the OWee?

Activities are also organised for those who don't fancy the whole student thing. Examples of these activities are an Open Air Cinema on the Markt, a Backstage Campus Tour where you get to see all the secret places on campus and Discover Delft where you learn about Delft's rich history.

I don't know anyone at all who is going to study in Delft, is it fun to join the OWee?

Then the OWee is just for you! You follow the OWee programme with your OWee group. This group consists of about ten incoming freshmen who are in exactly the same situation. They are all new students in Delft. There is always someone among them with whom you get along!

My studies are partly in another city. Should I walk the OWee after all?

A few Delft studies are taught in combination with another university. Molecular Science & Technology and Life Science & Technology take place partly in Leiden. For Nanobiology, you are sometimes in Rotterdam. For Clinical Technology studies, you can be found in Delft, Leiden and Rotterdam.

Rotterdam's introduction week is called Eurekaweek. This takes place from 21 to 24 August 2023, a week after the OWee! This means you can join both introduction weeks.

Leiden's introduction week is called EL CID and takes place from 14 to 18 August 2023. This is at the same time as the OWee. The programme has not been finalised yet, so it is still unclear to what extent it is possible to combine the introduction weeks of both cities. We will do our best to make sure this is possible so that everyone can participate in everything. Still, you might have to make a choice. In that case, it is useful to choose the city that appeals to you most or where you would like to live.

Can you participate in the OWee if you are under 18?

Yes, you can definitely take part in the OWee if you are under 18.

I am going to study at an Applied University in Delft, can I then participate in the OWee? Yes, of course! The OWee is for all prospective



students of the colleges and university in Delft. It is becoming increasingly common to take part in the OWee as an HBO student. Last year there were again hundreds of HBO students participating in the OWee!

Can I participate in the OWee if I am injured or have a disability?

Yes, you can! Most activities are not intensive, so you can just take part in them. If you still have doubts about your participation in the OWee, please contact us in time at info@owee.nl or call 015-2786709. We can then take it into account!

During the OWee

What is an OWee group?

An OWee group consists of about ten prospective students and two mentors. With this group, you follow your own OWee programme. The mentors have already studied in Delft for a year or more. As a result, they know a lot about studying and living in Delft, students and the city.

Is the OWee a hazing?

No, the OWee is not a hazing. The OWee is meant for all new students in Delft. It is organised from the colleges and the university so that you get acquainted with life in Delft. Participation in any part is entirely voluntary. You are not obliged to





Frequently Asked Questions

Where do I sleep during the OWee?

You have the choice that we arrange a place to sleep for you, or that you arrange it yourself by sleeping with someone you know, or know through someone else. If you choose us to arrange a place to sleep for you, you pay €7.50 for the whole week. You can indicate your preference whether you want to sleep at an association house and we will do our best to get you into that house!

Is it really important to sleep in Delft?

Yes! This week, you don't want to travel outside Delft. If you haven't yet arranged a place to sleep with someone, we advise you to book the sleeping place in addition. That way you sleep in Delft anyway!

I am a vegetarian or have a special diet.

Will this be taken into account?

All meals included in the registration fee are vegetarian! Participants with allergies can indicate this when registering. Adapted meals will be offered during the OWee for people with allergies. Anyone with gluten allergy, lactose intolerance and nut allergy can eat at clubs as much as she/he likes. For other allergies, meals are provided that can be collected, so you



Is it advisable to look for a house in Delft in or before the summer?

At large associations, many rooms normally become available in September. So if you are planning to enroll at a large association, you may choose to wait a while before looking for a house. Are you not planning to do this and do your parents live far from Delft? Then it is smart to start looking for a room before or during the summer.

Associations

How can I find out which student association I like?

One of the main goals of the OWee is to show prospective students which associations there are in Delft.

When can you sign up for an association?

The OWee is meant to get to know all the associations and to sign up with the one that appeals to you. Some associations have a membership freeze; if so, don't wait long to sign up. If you want to join but cannot be at the OWee, contact the relevant association.

What is the introduction time?

The introduction time (KMT) is a period during which new members of a student association get to know each other and the association. The content and duration of this time varies per association, but it usually starts immediately after the OWee. If you are planning to sign up for an association, it is wise to take into account that the association has an introductory time.


