- April 3 **Shisaa (Okinawan Lion) Day** \*The numbers 4/3 can be read as "Shi" "Sa" in Japanese. And Shisaa means lion in Okinawan language. Shishi in Jp.
- April 4 **Qingming or Seimei Day** which is the name of the 5<sup>th</sup> Solar term of the traditional Chinese lunisolar calendar. **International Mine Awareness Day**. Also **Yo-yo Day** was started in Japan by the Japanese toy maker Bandai as 4/4 can be read as "Yo(n)-yo(n)" in Japanese.
- April 5 **Ogasawara Return Memorial Day** to commemorate an agreement to return to the Ogasawara Islands, which had been under US administration since World War II, to Japan.
- April 6 International Day of Sport for Development and Peace to commemorate the 1<sup>st</sup> Olympic games which was held in Athene in 1896.
- April 7 World Health Day. On this day in 1948, WHO was founded. Also Honen Shonin's Birthday. Born on this day in 1133 and founded Jodo Shu in 1175. This year marks 850<sup>th</sup> anniversary since founding of Jodo Shu!
- April 8 **Buddha's Birthday** aka **Hanamatsuri** to commemorate the Buddha's birthday. Also **Venus Day.** On this day in 1820, a farmer named Yorgos discovered a statue of Venus inside a cave on the island of Milo on the Aegean Sea.
- April 9 **Great Buddha's Day** which commemorates the dedication ceremony for the Great Buddha of Todaiji Temple in Nara in 752.
- April 10 **Woman's Day**. On this day in 1946, the first general election with universal suffrage for both men and women were held after world Wall II, marking the first time women exercised their right to vote in Japan. During the election, 89 women ran as candidates and 39 were elected.
- April 12 International Day of Human Space Flight. On this day in 1961, the world's first manned spacecraft, the Soviet Union's Vostok 1 was launched into orbit.
- April 15 World-wide Biomedical Laboratory Science Day
- April 16 **Chaplin's Day** to commemorate the birthday of Charles Chaplin in 1889.
- April 17 World Hemophilia Day
- April 18 World Amateur Radio Day
- April 19 **Japanese Map Day**. On this day in 1800, Tadataka Inou left for Hokkaido to make the very first map of Japan.
- April 20 **Postal Service Day** which commemorates the establishment of the postal system in Japan on April 20, 1871, replacing the previous courier system.
- April 21 World Creativity and Innovation Day to commemorate the birthday of Leonard Da Vinci in 1452.
- April 22 International Mother Earth Day aka Earth Day. Proposed by Gaylord Nelson in 1970.
- April 23 World Book and Copyright Day \*
- April 26 International Chernobyl Disaster Remembrance Day\* The nuclear disaster occurred in 1986. World Intellectual Property Day to commemorate the founding of the World Intellectual Property Organization in 1970.
- April 27 International Marconi Day
- April 28 World Day for Safety and Health at Work
- April 29 Showa Day to honor the birthday of Emperor Showa (Hirohito) who was born in 1901. International Dance Day which honors the birthday of Jean-Georges Noverre.
- April 30 International Jazz Day to deepen the understanding of various cultures. around the world through Jazz and to spread jazz to children living in the regions where there is still not enough access to education.

Japanese Buddhism in Hawaii has a very unique cultural background. In Japan, Buddhist customs differ from village to village, town to town, prefecture to prefecture. This is because Buddhism has been localized to fit to the custom in each area. Since Japanese immigrants came to Hawaii from the various regions of Japan, ceremonial customs are different according to the area where the family came from. However, as time passes, those customs are becoming unclear and more confusing for the younger generations. Because of this confusion, younger generations seem to be going away from Buddhism by saying that Buddhism is hard to understand. Therefore, in this article, I would like to explain the standard procedure of doing a service. First, let me show you the two common procedures of having funerals
