ABOUT US: The [Caribbean Research Group](#) (CRG) is a team of medical students dedicated to bridging the research opportunities gap between American and Caribbean medical schools. Our team partners with US and Canadian physicians to help advance relevant research and simultaneously works to identify gaps in the medical literature.

TIMELINE: After confirming a project with a physician, our group will organize the below team members to a given research project within two weeks. The complete team of 3 students (subject to change depending on partnered physician's preferences) will then meet with the physician to confirm a project timeline and work with them to see through the project until publication. After the project is completed, but before sending the project back to the physician for final edits, an editor from our team will review the project for quality control.

PROJECT TEAM: Below we have provided some more information on the roles and responsibilities that members of our organization will have on any given research project:

Senior Lead

- Serve as first author and responsible for the bulk of the academic writing.

Analysts (2)

- Responsible for data collection, literature review, creating figures/legends, and assisting in writing.

Editor

- An appointed student who has had prior research writing and reviewing experience.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

As of March 2023, we have 5 official publications, 3 abstracts that were presented at national conferences and 8 projects being prepared for submission.
