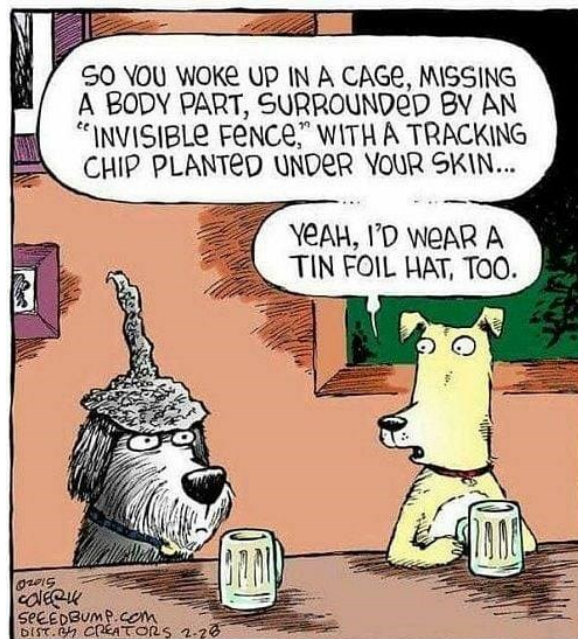
President's Report:

We Are Launching An Interact Club

Early 2020, in a joint venture between Rotary Frankston Sunrise and Peninsula Rotaract, we will launch an Interact Club at Frankston High School!

So what is Interact?

Interact is a key part of Rotary's Youth Programs and is a service club for youth aged 13-18 who want to engage in community service while having fun. There are more than 20,000 Interact Clubs operating in 159 countries around the world.

Students design and implement two projects each year: one for their school or local community, and one that promotes international understanding.

The students run the Club and will make their own decisions as to the projects they undertake. As sponsors of the club, Rotary and Rotaract will act as mentors. The Interact Club will meet 2 lunch times per month at meetings attended by a Rotarian & Rotaract mentor.

For the students, this is a great opportunity to make a difference both locally and internationally. They will develop leadership and organisational skills. They will have the ability to connect with the Rotary & Rotaract network around the world and to engage with Interact Clubs across the globe. It will expand their understanding of issues here and abroad and dovetails in well with the school's overall leadership development agenda. The enthusiastic response received from Frankston High and Principal John Albiston bodes well for the future of Interact at the school.

For the Rotaract Club, it continues to support their own development as community leaders and introduces them and engages them with prospective future Rotaractors. For us at Rotary Frankston Sunrise, it is a great opportunity to engage with emerging young people in the area. It opens a connection with the broader school community and extends our impact both here and abroad.

So preparations for the launch are underway, with an announcement to be made to the students at key assemblies on November 28. The formal launch of the club will happen in late February, early March 2020.

This should not be confused with RAWCS who are distributing Government Funds. The 2019 National Fundraiser will be an incredible Public Relations opportunity for our membership and Clubs.

The public and Corporate funds will be managed by the DGs via an Appeal Distribution Committee. Rotary Districts in drought affected areas will work with Clubs to identify persons / families in need of assistance; such as food, education supplies, health services, clothing etc. The Districts will compile a Register of persons/families in need of assistance. Each District will then request a block grant via the Bendigo Bank on-line portal which will be processed by a Grants Advisory Committee. Our D9820 Governor Adrian Froggatt is a member of the Appeal Distribution Committee.

Vocational on-site visits...always interesting...the committee members have been requested to organize a couple of on-site visits...watch this space.

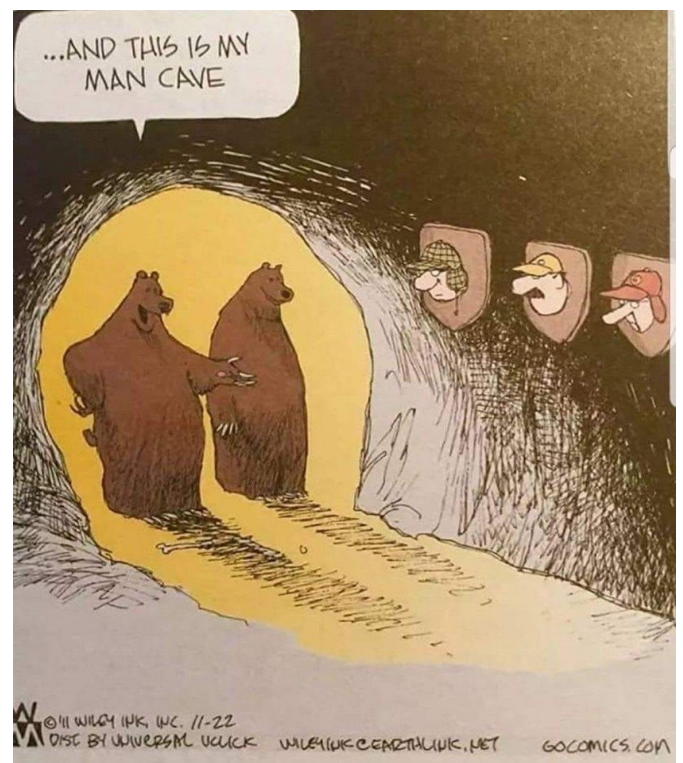
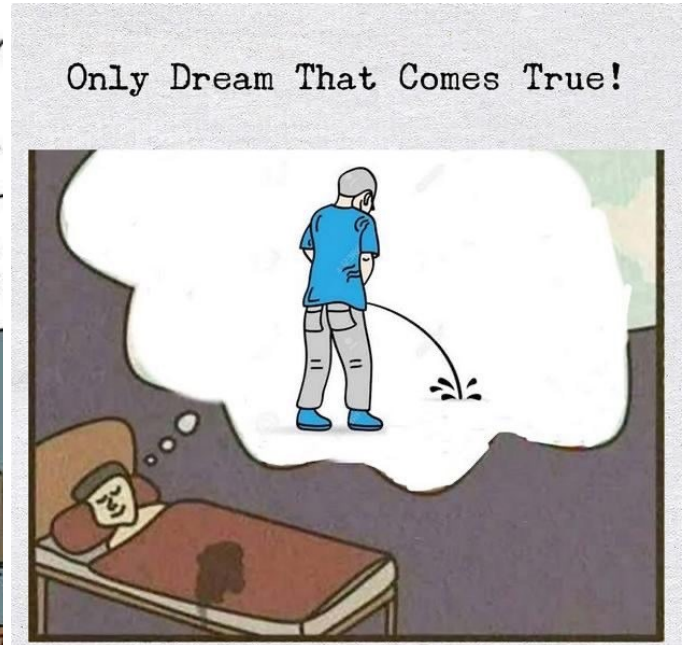
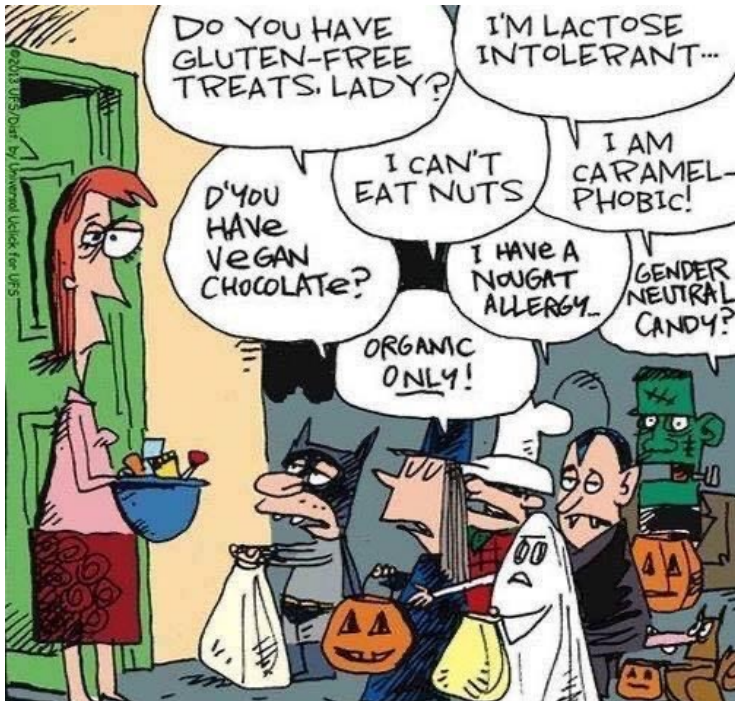
Rob and I held a meeting in September 2019 to discuss various topics.
