



CERVINO, CRESTA HÖRNLI (CH)

The ascent to the summit of the Matterhorn (4,478 m) from the Via Normale Svizzera in the footsteps of the mountaineers who conquered this perfect pyramid for the first time. The Via Hörnli, from Zermatt, passes through the iconic Hörnlihutte Refuge: reserve your place in advance and conquer Mount Cervino with the Monviso Outdoor ® Alpine Guides.



PLAN

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The Via Normale Svizzera is technically less difficult than the Cresta del Leone, however it should not be underestimated: the overall development, the length and complexity of the itinerary, the innumerable possibilities of error inherent in the route, combined with the altitude and a particularly severe environment, make the extremely demanding climb, to be tackled only in good weather and environmental conditions.

DAY 1

Difference in height: 680 mAscend time: 2 h Meeting point: meeting point in Zermatt for equipment check and short briefing.

Take the lifts up to the Schwarzsee station (2,583 m). Then with an easy path you reach the Hörnlihutte, a splendid refuge at the foot of the homonymous ridge. From here the view of the Matterhorn is impressive.

DAY 2

Difference in height: 1,220 mAscend/descent time: 10-12 hours

Wake up, breakfast and departure around 05:00. From the start the route is quite difficult and sustained up to the summit where we can enjoy a breathtaking view. The descent from Monte Cervino, along the same ascent route, is impressive and always demanding, perhaps more so than the ascent.

EQUIPMENT

- mountaineering boots
- backpack 30l
- mountaineering helmet
- harness
- longe or daisychain
- ice ax
- classic crampons with anti-slog
- sleeping bag (mandatory in the refuge)
- mineral salts
- 11 min bottle or thermos
- energy bars or dried fruit
- high protection sunscreen and lip balm with sunscreen (cocoa butter)
- first aid kit (thermal blanket, elasto, compeed, aspirin, painkillers, ...)
- headlamp (with new and spare batteries)

ABBIGLIAMENTO

- wool cap or hat with fleece inside
- buff (collar)
- sun hat
- glacier/high mountain sunglasses
- duvet (optional)
- waterproof jacket (Gore-tex, pac-lite, conduit...) shell type (fourth layer)
- windstopper shirt or Primaloft type insulating garment (third layer)
- fiber turtleneck (second layer)
- Breathable T-shirts n.2 (first layer)
- spare light gloves n.1 pair
- heavy gloves n.1 pair
- mountain pant in shoeller
- waterproof overtrousers (Gore-tex®, Paclite®, conduit, K-Way®)
- under trousers or tights
- mountain socks (n.2 pairs)
