This change in name was partly due to the charter of the Rotary Club of Melbourne in April 1921 and so this Rotary Year 2020/2021 sees the celebration of 100 years of Rotary service to the community in Australia.

Matthew is a young man who has developed a strong rapport with many of Council's youth workers over several years. Frankston Youth Service has supported Matt with housing, employment, budgeting, and how to set, work towards and achieve goals. He is especially grateful for the role that the youth team has played in helping him develop a more positive outlook and mind set in his day-to-day life.

"As youth workers it is always great to see how a young person's character develops, and how they mature over time," said Youth Programs Team Leader, Ilya Grin.

"Our relationship with Matt has enabled us to offer support and guidance when he needed it most. We have been in the privileged position to assist Matt with many of his major life transitions."

"They helped me look at things in a more positive way, which has opened me up to more opportunities," said Matthew

Matthew has now found a place to live and work, and has just recently picked up his first car (which he saved up for himself), after gaining his driving license through Council's L2P Program. Matt has overcome many significant challenges within his life, and continues to visit Youth Central to touch base with the youth workers and share with the team how he is traveling in his life journey. On this day in... August 5 :

Event: 1305 - William Wallace, who led Scottish resistance to England, is captured by the English near Glasgow and transported to London for trial and execution. **1858** - First transatlantic telegraph cable lands at Trinity Bay, Newfoundland spearheaded by Cyrus West Field (will fail after 3 weeks). **1861** - President Lincoln signs the first US personal Income Tax into law (3% of incomes over \$800). **2018** - Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull declares "now we are a land of droughts" as 99% of New South Wales affected. **2019** - July 2019 confirmed as world's hottest-ever month recorded according to Europe's Copernicus Programme.

Births: 1908 - Harold Holt, Prime Minister of Australia (1966-67). **1930** - Neil Armstrong, American X-15 pilot and astronaut - 1st man on the Moon (Gemini 8, Apollo 11). **1951** - John Jarratt, Australian actor. **1956** - Maureen McCormick, American actress (Marcia-Brady Bunch).

Deaths: 1952 - Sameera Moussa, Egyptian nuclear scientist (the first female Egyptian nuclear physicist. Sameera held a doctorate in atomic radiation. She hoped her work would one day lead to affordable medical treatments and the peaceful use of atomic energy). 1962 - Marilyn Monroe [Norma Jean Mortenson], American actress (Some Like It Hot). 2000 - Alec Guinness, British actor (The Ladykillers, The Bridge on the River Kwai). 2019 - Toni Morrison [Chloe Anthony Wofford], American writer (Tar Baby, Beloved, Song of Solomon), first African American woman to win a Nobel Prize (2010).
