

Hawaii Jodo shu Chronology Year 1893-2024

1893

- September "Hawaii Senkyokai (Association to propagate the Jodo Shu Teachings) was established.
- September 5 Published 'Advertisement for Recruiting Overseas Missionaries' and 'Purpose of Propagation in Hawaii' in the Jodo Buddhist monthly magazine."
- October 25 Advertisement for soliciting donations for the propagation of Jodo teachings in Hawaii published in the Jodo Buddhist monthly magazine.

1894

- March 25 Rev. Taijo Matsuo arrived in Hawaii sent by Hawaii Senkyokai.
- May 14 Rev. Gakuo Okabe arrived in Hawaii sent by Hawaii Senkyokai.

1895

Rev. Matsuo started propagation on Oahu and on Kauai
Rev. Gakuo Okabe started propagation on Big Island.

1896

- November 26 The first Buddhist temple "Hamakua Bukkyokaido (currently Hamakua Jodo Mission)" welcomed the Buddha Statue and opening ceremony
- March Rev. Makaen Tanaka arrived in Hawaii (7years and 6 months) and assigned to the 2nd minister of Hamakua.
- April 14
- June 4 Rev. Gakuo Okabe resigned and returned to Japan
- August 19 Rev. Taijo Matsuo returned to Japan due to his sickness
- September 13 Rev. Matsuo passed away

1899

Year of the 5th Anniversary

- February 16 Rev. Taijo Yasuda (The 1st official minister sent by Jodo Shu HQ, 4 years and 6 months) arrived in Hawaii and assigned to Hamakua Buddhist Temple.
- May Rev. Taijo Yasuda was transferred to the Laupahoehoe area and began propagation of Jodo Shu.
- December 24 Laupahoehoe was established, and Japanese language education was started. (Rev. Taijo Yasuda)
- 1900 Rev. Enjo Ito arrived in Hawaii (17years) and stationed at Laupahoehoe.
- 1901 Rev. Shoshin Anzai arrived in Hawaii (3 years) and stationed at Hamakua Buddhist Temple.
- September 19 Hamakua Buddhist Temple started a primary school and new dormitory built.

- February Rev. Shoshin Anzai was transferred to the Kohala area and began propagation. Rev. Enjo Ito was transferred to Olaa area.
- May Olaa Buddhist Temple and primary school was established (Rev. Enjo Ito)
- December 29 Rev. Ryosho Kobayashi arrived in Hawaii (5years) and stationed at Laupahoehoe Buddhist Temple.
- ### 1903
- March The first chief minister, Rev. Shinjun Shimizu arrived in Hawaii (5 years and 5 months)

March	Rev. Shimizu established the Kyoku office in the Laupahoehoe Buddhist Temple. Rev. Hidetaka Iwasaki arrived in Hawaii and stationed at Hamakua Buddhist Temple. He traveled to U.S. mainland in the same year.
March	The first ministers' meeting in Hawaii was held at the Laupahoehoe Buddhist Temple.
April 5	Kapaau Buddhist Temple was established. (Rev. Anzai)
July	Rev. Ryoshu Kobayashi became the 2 nd minister of Laupahoehoe Buddhist temple and new primary school was built.
1904	Year of the 10th Anniversray
February	The chief minister, Rev. Shinjun Shimizu moved to Kapaau Buddhist Temple and relocated the Kyoku office there.
February 28	Rev. Shoshin Anzai returned temporarily to Japan, received summons while on the board at the ocean, resigned as Kapaau resident minister after arriving in Japan.
April	Rev. Senri Soma arrived in Hawaii (3 years), stationed at the Laupahoehoe Buddhist Temple, was transferred to the Hakalau area and began propagation of Jodo Shu
November 30	Rev. Jonen Shimizu arrived in Hawaii (5 years) and stationed at the Hamakua Buddhist Temple.
November 30	Rev. Yukei Kimura arrived in Hawaii (4 years) and was assigned to Kapaau Buddhist Temple (2 nd minister).
1905	
January	Rev. Shinjun Shimizu moved to Honolulu and began his missionary work.
January 7	Rev. Shindo Haneda arrived in Hawaii (and passed away while working for 4 years and 6 months) and stationed at Olaa Buddhist Temple and became the resident minister.
February 19	Hakalau Buddhist Temple with a primary school was established. (Rev. Senri Soma)
June	Rev. Enjo Ito was transferred to Honolulu.
June 20	Rev. Ryosho Kobayashi was transferred to Wainaku area and began propagation. In September, Wainaku Jodo Shu Buddhist Temple was established.
July 2	The 1 st branch temple of Jodo Shu in Honolulu was opened. (Rev. Shinjun Shimizu)
September	Rev. Jonen Ikeda became the 3 rd minister of Hamakua Buddhist Temple. Hawi Branch of the Kapaau Japanese Primary School was opened. (Rev. Yukei Kimura)

March 2	Rev. Kentatsu Tenki arrived in Hawaii (4 years and 8 months) and became the 3 rd resident minister of Laupahoehoe Jodo Shu Buddhist Temple.
March 2	Rev. Ozen Suzuki arrived in Hawaii (3 years and 5 months) and served as the principle of the Hawi branch. He also organized Hawi Buddhist Temple and began propagation. Rev. Kanseki Shimizu arrived in Hawaii (14 years) and became the principal of Honokaa Japanese Primary School.
October 14	Rev. Shinkyō Tachikawa arrived in Hawaii (first term of over 2 years), became the principal of Okala Japanese Primary School

- September Jodo Shu Kaikyoin (currently Jodo Mission of Hawaii) was established in Honolulu. (Rev. Shinjun Shimizu)

- July Rev. Jonen Ikeda became the Jodo Shu Kaikyoin in Honolulu, and Rev. Enjo Ito became the 2nd chief minister of the Jodo Shu Kaikyoin.
- November 25 Rev. Ninkai Nakanishi arrived in Hawaii (5 years and 2 months) and was assigned to Kapaau Buddhist Temple (as the 4th minister).
- December 29 Rev. Shodo Hara arrived in Hawaii (4 years and 7 months) and stationed at Jodo Shu Kaikyoin.

Rev. Shoshin Inouye, the 5th Kyoku President, arrived in Hawaii (1 year and 8 months)

Rev. and Mrs. Soen Amano arrived in Hawaii (5 years and 9 months) and stationed at Kaikyoin.

 by a nun named Koshinan, who risked her life to jump into the fire and save the
 temple. The bronze seated statue of Amitabha survived the fire. Rev. Gensho
 Hara and his family, along with those who had gathered at the temple to fight
 the fire, were able to evacuate and were safe. Four members of the congregation
 lost their lives in the fire, and many others lost their homes to the blaze.
