As I did not have a publisher and was not willing to invest serious money in a professional native speaker translation, I tried out Google Translate and deepL Translate, finally giving preference to the latter. Both this step and the decision to be my own final editor contain risks, which I am well aware of. However, there is enough original, so far unpublished material on harmonica history in the book, which should be able to outshine a potentially clumsy or even non-idiomatic presentation. You find this material mainly in the chapters Freeway stop with consequences, An American in Markneukirchen, From Jazz to the Battle of Hermann, Just like in a fairy tale, Between the sheets (Hohner visit), The mystery of Arthur Turelly, World success despite blinders, Closer to the cradle (Seydel visit). Apart from this, I recommend the book to anybody interested in German-American relations in the 20th century and in intercultural studies.
