CELEBRATING THE 850th ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF JODO SHU AND THE 130th ANNIVERSARY OF HAWAII JODO SHU

With deep gratitude to our Great Master, Honen Shonin, and to countless Pure Land masters, teachers, and members, we celebrated the 850th Anniversary of the founding of Jodo Shu and the 130th Anniversary of Hawaii Jodo Shu. The commemorative services, officiated by Archbishop Kokyo Kawanaka, Secretary General of Jodo Shu, with assistance by nearly 40 ministers, was held on October 20 at the Honolulu Betsuin. Embraced by Amida Buddha's unconditional love, we recited *Namu Amida Butsu* together with deep appreciation.

DEBRIS REMOVAL STARTED ON NOVEMBER 2

US Army Corp of Engineers and debris removal contractor Hui Huliau have begun the debris removal process at the temple's property on November 2nd. The temple, pagoda, social hall, minister's residence, 8 rental units and storage units are all slated to be completely removed. Buddha and bell tower base are not being removed. We are expecting the property to be cleared by the end of the month and will have a thorough update in next month bulletin.

The urns in the pagoda are secure in one of the containers on the temple property, we will establish a timeline for cleaning the urns and working to identify your family urns after the debris removal process is completed. Thank you for your understanding and patience.

RESOURCES FOR LAHAINA MEMBERS

For those directly effected by the fire, please get yourself on the disaster case management (DCM) list by calling 211. Although it may take a long-time to get assigned a case manager, this program is the gateway for other resources.

Homeowners- if you haven't yet gone to speak to Hawaii Community Lending, they have been working to find resources and funding for owner occupied homeowners. Currently there is funding available for property survey, they are even reimbursing property owners if they already did a survey.

County has released the draft of the Long-Term Recovery Plan (available for viewing on www.mauirecovers.org website) feedback is open till November 15th. Final plan will be open to the public in December. This plan proposes 40 projects that lay the ground work for Lahaina's recovery.
