

# Religions in austria


#### Religionen in Österreich



- Almost 5 Mio Catholics
- 2nd biggest group:
   Muslims
- Almost 3/4 believe in one God
- 2 Mio without religious confession

### **Development of Catholics**

- → Less and less people feel affiliated to a religion
- → Last 20 years people without religious beliefs have increased (12% → 22,5%)
- → Countryside much more Catholics
- → Church tax

#### Main festivities:

- Easter
- Christmas
- New Year's Eve

#### Easter:

Loads of decorations:

- Easter Eggs hanging on trees
- Fake Easter Bunnies

#### Maypole:

- Countryside of Austria
- On May 1st
- Dancing around it
- Often gets stolen from other villages





### Visible Festivities: Christmas

Christmas Markets (Christkindlmarkt) everywhere around the city, in Vienna there is about 20 of them Things you can get at a christmas market:

- Punsch (with or without alcohol)
- Waffles and crêpes
- Candied almonds and apples
- Potato fritters
- Presents

#### Plenty of decorations:

- Fairy lights
- Decorated christmas trees









## Churches in general


Definition: place where christs exercise faith

Most of them have towers, cupola sometimes

Ground plan mostly the same (gotic) (not modern)







### Styles of churches

Romanesque: massive churches, only sacral buildings, cupolas, from 900 to 1240 (Austria), few decoration, not too much of them because changed

Gothic: high,thin buildings, from France, in Austria from 1250 to 1530, pointed arches, coloured glass windows, quite often in Austria

Baroque: very rich decorations, gold, sculptures, stuck, from italy, in Austria from 1650-1750,

cupolas, paintings on the ceiling or in cupola







### Judaism in Austria

- In 1938 the 206.00 israelites made 3% of the austrian citizens
- At the moment only 5.400 Jews are living in Austria, which equals to 0.06 % of the total population
- Most of the Jews living in Austria have returned from the former Soviet Union since
   1945

Austria had the first Museum about art and Monuments in Judaism between 1895-



# Synagogues in Austria

- In Austria are 37 churches for israelites, most of them are in Vienna.
- The most popular synagogue is the Stadttempel in the capital of austria.
- The building exists since 1826 and was planned by Joseph Kornhäusl.
- Non Catholic churches had to be tucked away.





### Islam in Austria

- Islam is the largest minority religion in the country practiced by 7.9% of the total population.
- Most Muslims came to Austria during the 1960s as migrant workers from Turkey and Yugoslavia.
- In late 1904 Bosnian Muslim students in Vienna established the first Muslim association in Austria.
- Almost 88% of Austrian Muslims feel closely connected with Austria and more than 62% of Muslims have routine leisure time contact with people of other religions.





### Mosques in Austria


- Austrians Islam map: there is over 600 mosques in Austria
- Islamic center in vienna: one of the largest mosques in Austria that was founded in 1979, The center provides some facilities that teach you about Islam.
- Al-Nour Islam center In Graz Austria: it was founded in 1993, Visitors to the Al-Nour Mosque originally come from over 30 countries of origin and reflect the cosmopolitan character of the community
