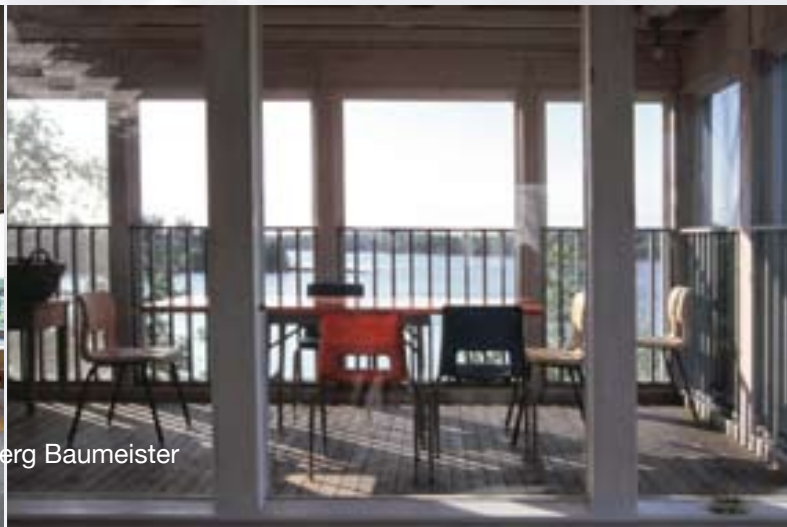

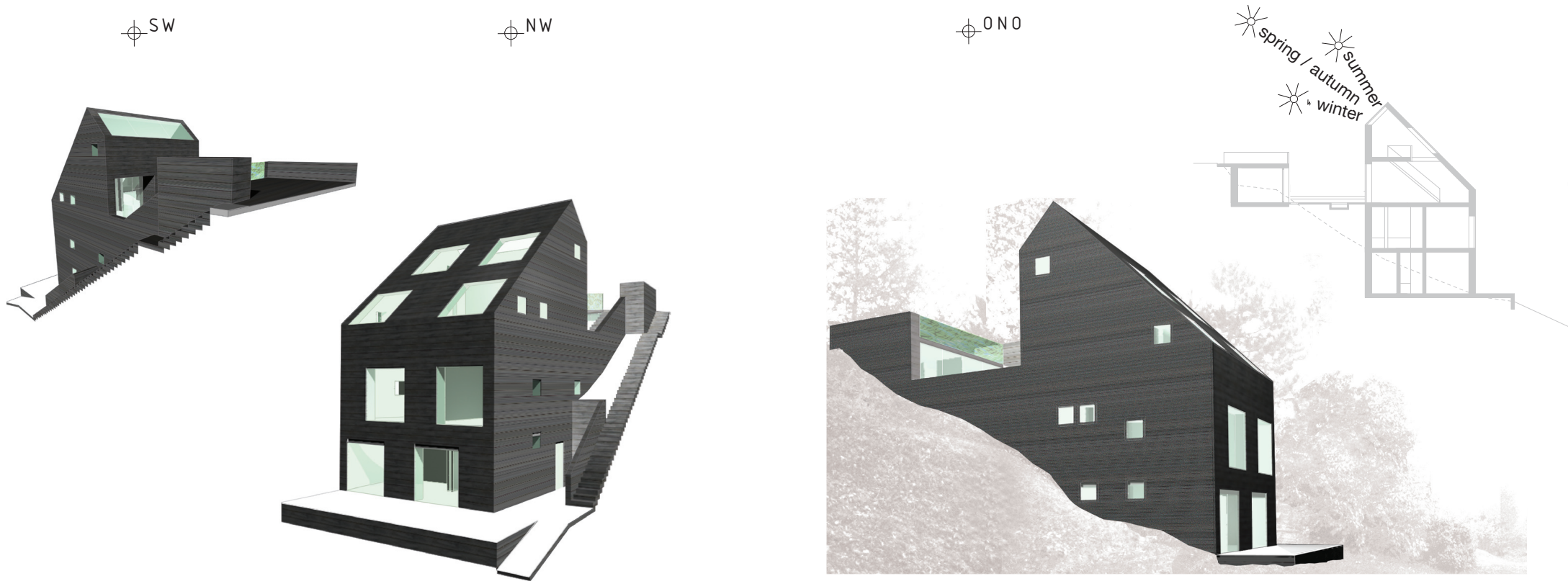


German Urban Design Award

First Prizes and Awards (Schinkel-Award)

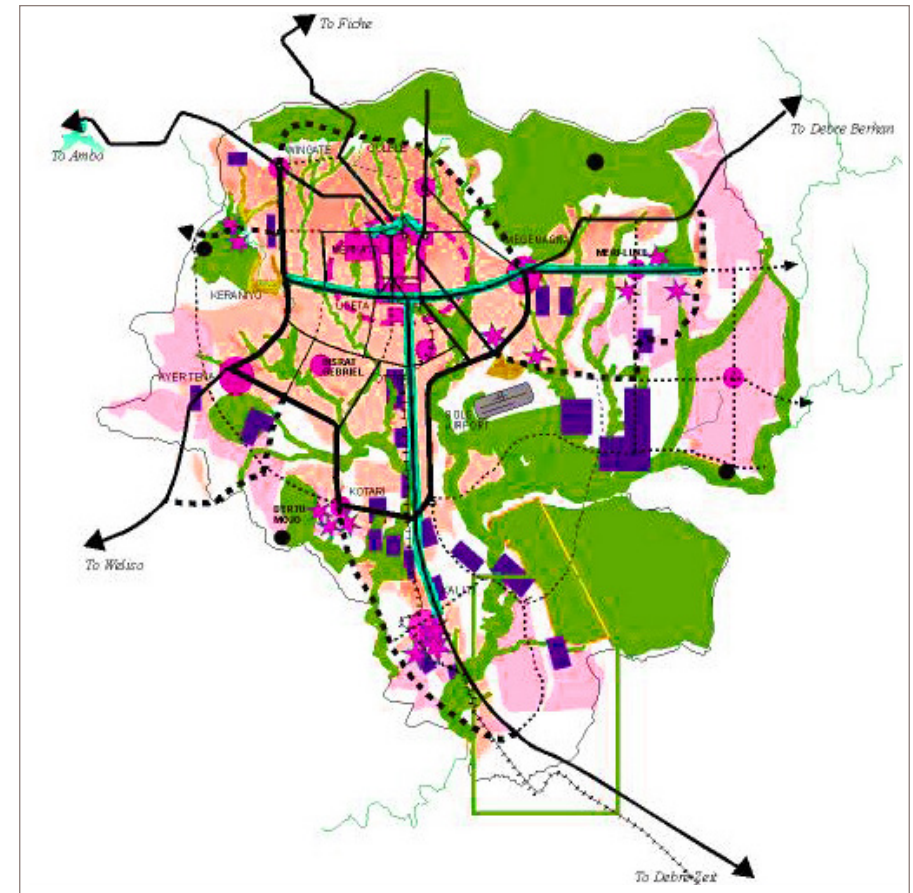


OS29 close to Stuttgart, Germany on a north-facing steep hillside shaped to catch a maximum amount of sunlight

Upgrading of the existing territory and expansion with new buildings, which are arranged around three central squares (1-3)



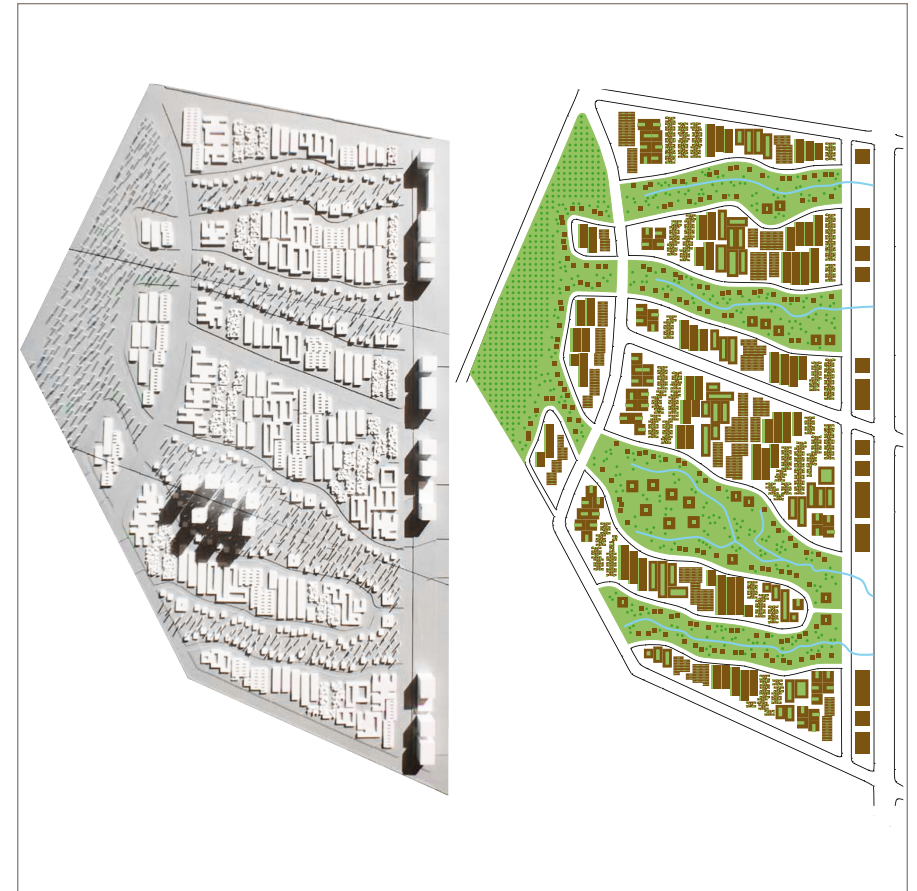
Urban Development Plan, Addis Ababa

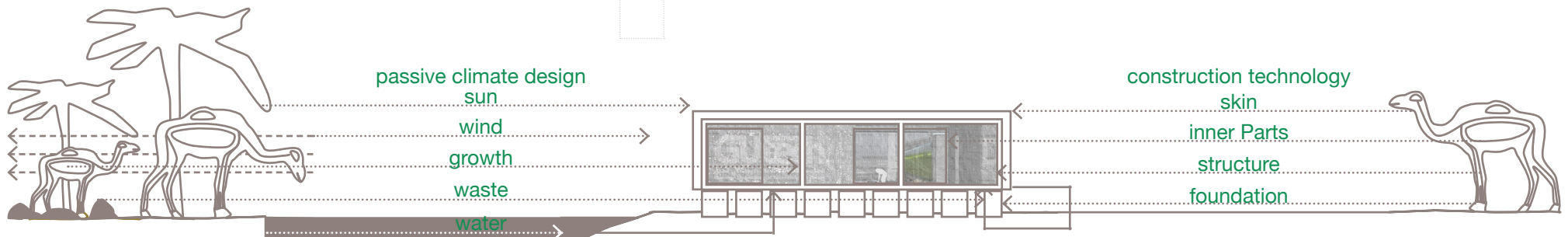
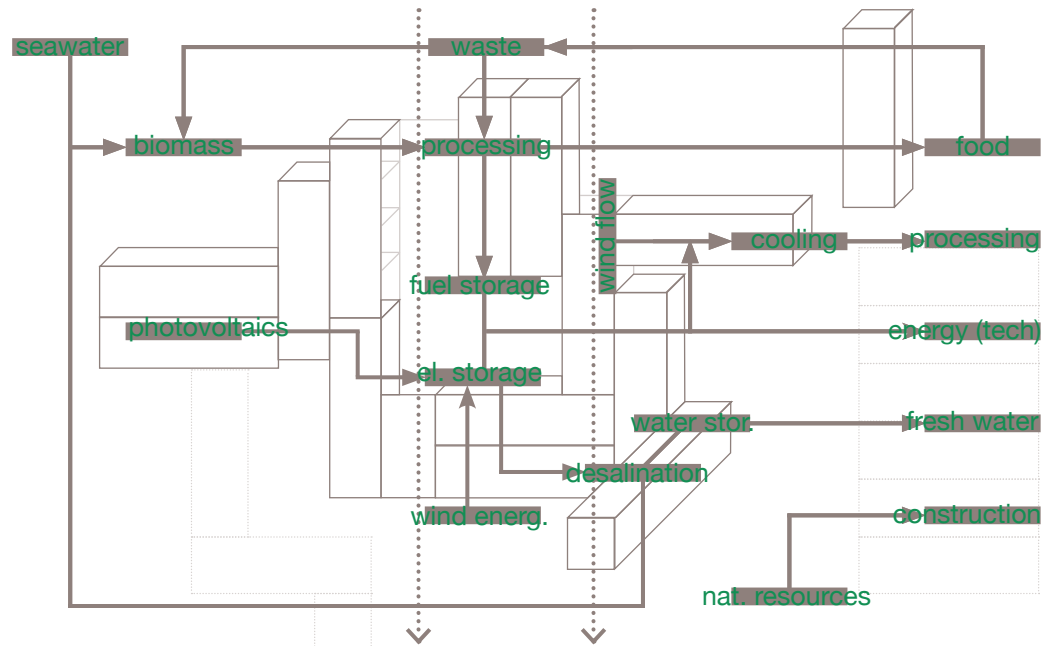


Capacity building for affordable housing in Africa with local materials for better environments, communities, and income

A street more than a street - Instead, a park like no other... incubating the area's unique creative culture and sense of place

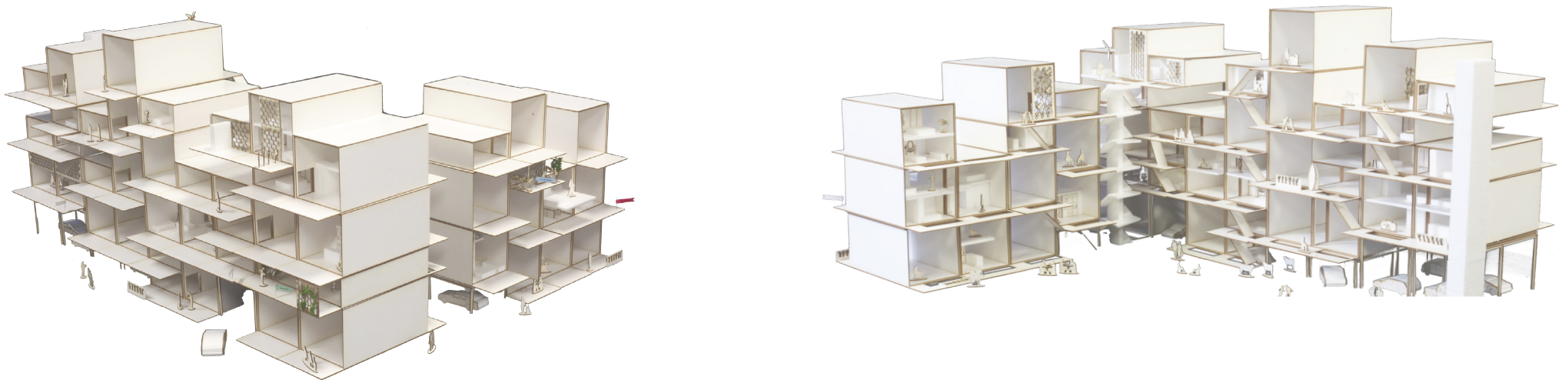

Housing+: From industrialisation to mass customisation; flexible in terms of positioning, height, facade, equipment, climate

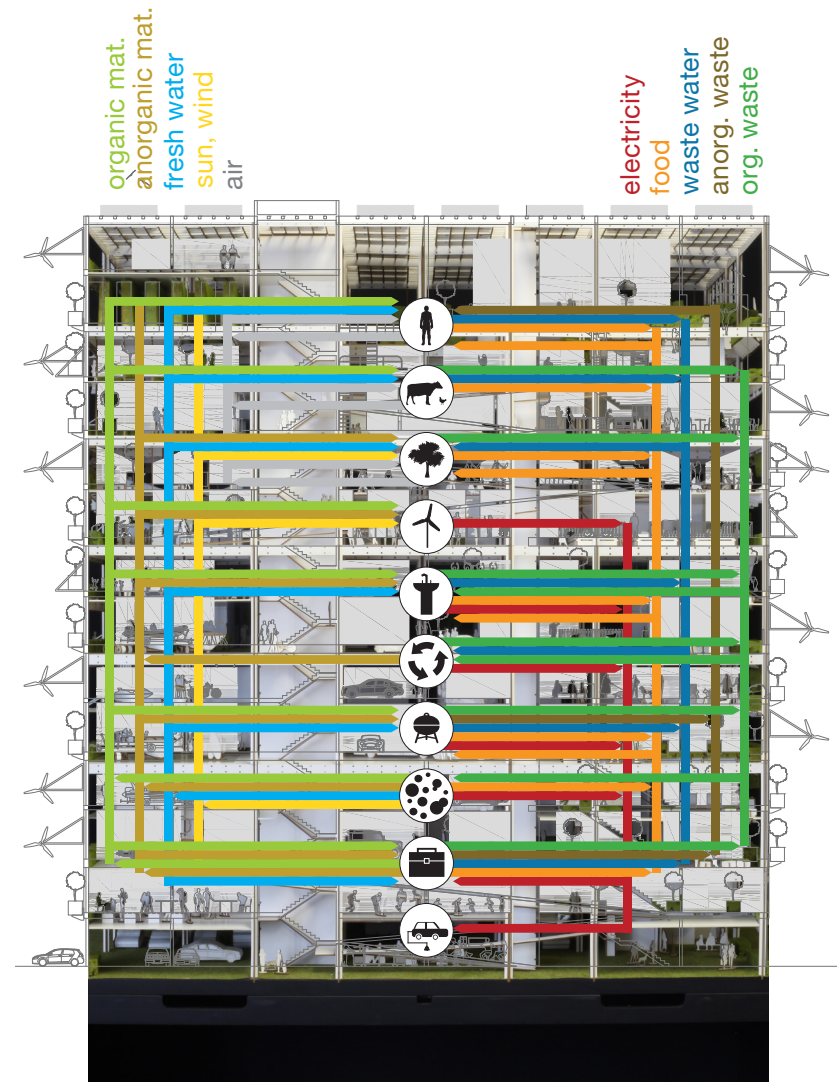
