Model NATO Germany is looking for volunteers to organize the 3<sup>rd</sup> Model NATO Germany, taking place from the 10<sup>th</sup> to the 14<sup>th</sup> of November 2025, as

### Chair in the Academics Department

As a non-profit organization, Model NATO Germany is dedicated to ensuring a sustainable future for NATO as an institution of collective defense. Our mission is to empower the next generation of decision-makers and passionate students with a profound understanding of NATO's values, decision-making processes, political intricacies, and its pivotal role in transatlantic security.

During a four-day simulation, we will grant 96 students and young professionals from Germany and abroad the opportunity to address a hypothetical crisis scenario within the mechanisms and processes of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. Filling the roles of National Representatives working in delegations, the students will have to coordinate their actions beyond their assigned committees and negotiate their standpoints within both the North Atlantic Council, the Military Committee, as well as a scenario-dependent third committee.

As **Chair** your role will be twofold. Prior to the conference, you will review and prepare relevant documents for the participants, including the Rules of Procedure and functionality of NATO bodies and other relevant institutions. You will additionally prepare and host Rules of Procedure Workshops digitally. During the conference itself, you will be one of two Chairs on each committee, ensuring a smooth conference procedure and an enjoyable atmosphere.

For this position in particular, we are looking for people who have a broad overview of current security policy dynamics as well as a good knowledge of the structure, goals, and political processes within NATO. Ideally, you have previous experience in simulations like Model United Nations, Model NATO, or Model European Union and have already chaired at these simulations before. Furthermore, you should have good organizational skills, the ability to work in a team, under pressure and independently, as well as good writing skills.

We offer the opportunity to gather valuable experience with project management and the creation of simulation/scenario exercises, as well as to deepen one's knowledge of NATO and current security crises. In addition, this activity offers working with a great team of students who are passionate about security policy, contact with numerous delegations from NATO member countries, and experience in dealing with exciting issues and ideas in the context of the crisis.
