## Amplifying the voice of the Para-Sport community

We invite you, our international colleagues, to join us for the 3rd Clean Sport Insight Forum. The forum will bring together the international anti-doping community, social science researchers, athletes, and Government representatives to help bridge the gap between policy, practice, and research in the field of doping prevention.

This event forms part of the RESPECT-P project which is an Erasmus+ funded programme which is organised by the Clean Sport Alliance.

This Clean Sport Insight Forum will share educational practice, highlights from relevant social science research, athlete views on clean sport and shall be hosted by UK Anti-Doping (UKAD).

**C** — Lead the **CONVERSATION** between para-athletes, athlete support personnel, policy makers, and academics in an open and honest environment to facilitate the sharing of learning, experience, and ideas.

**L** — Change the **LENS** through which sport and the anti-doping system is viewed.

**E** — Advocate for change to rebalance the system so that **EDUCATION** is recognised and funded as a fundamental part of a clean sport system.

**A** — Adopt an **ATHLETE-FOCUSED** approach, listening to para-athletes, believing they are central to protecting Clean Sport.

**N** — Create a **NETWORK** capable of leading change for the future of clean sport.



The agenda will include speakers ranging from para-athletes, academics and NADOs, and explore why, as a collective, much more must be done to prevent doping.

The anti-doping system can do more to put athletes at the heart of its work and to rebalance the system from catching and punishing to helping and protecting them. The sessions will focus on the importance of evidenced-based policy and practice to help our collective prevention efforts.

The event ethos will be to promote open and honest dialogue as well as setting a clear path for the next conference which will be held in Münster in September 2022.
