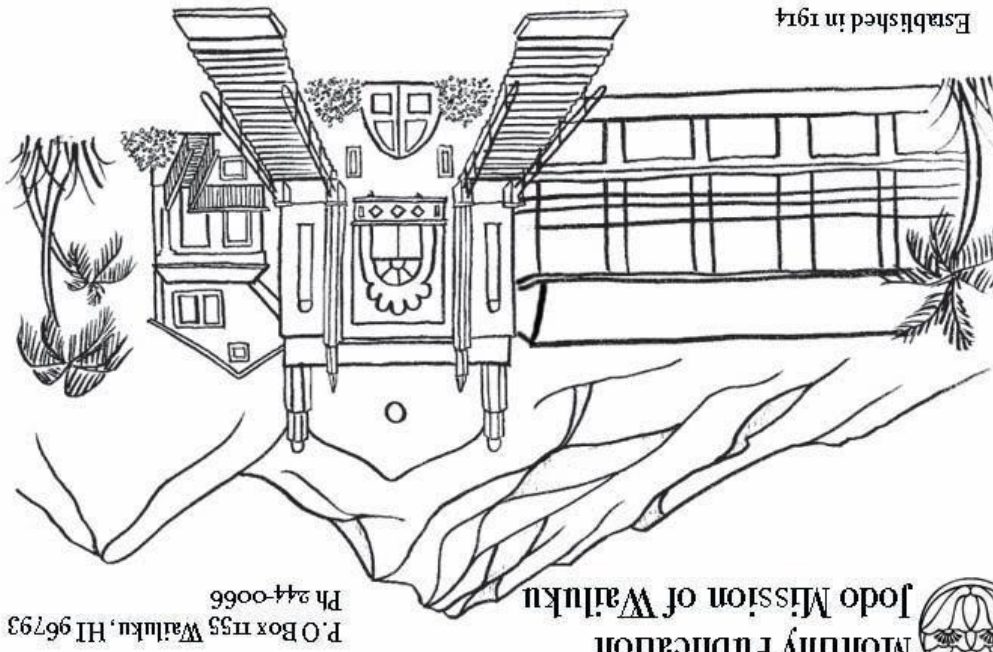

Minister's Message

Dear Members & Friends,

This month's Jodo Shu Calendar saying reminds me of the Latin phrase, *Carpe diem* "seize the day." The entirety of the phrase is "seize the day, put little trust in tomorrow. In many ways we truly do not know what tomorrow brings us, as it is the present moment that we live. In Buddhism the present moment is what we should be mindful of and be grateful for. The Jodo Buddhist practice emphasizes the daily recitation of Amida Buddha's name. This in turn allows us to pay attention to the present moment and appreciate those we've lost and those we continue to love.

The equinox is the time of year where Buddhist celebrate O-Higan, also translated as the other shore. The other shore representing Nirvana or the Pure Land. West of here is the Pure Land, when the sun sets take a moment to listen to the sky and call upon Amida Buddha's name to invite the spirits of your loved ones to your hearts and minds. Let us daily find the time in our busy schedule to appreciate the gift of life as we sometimes forget or become distracted by our daily affairs.

Brief History of Chado Urasenke Maui Kyokai:

Chado Urasenke Maui Association was founded in 1988 with about 15 members. It was officially recognized and registered on July 21st, 1991, by 15th Master of Urasenke, Sen Soshitsu, who turned 99 years old and is now Grand Master of Urasenke. In 2019, it celebrated its 30th anniversary with dignitaries from Kyoto, including Grand Master. Before the pandemic, Chado Urasenke Maui Association showcased Tea Ceremonies to the public 3-4 times a year. The biggest events were Hatusudate, the first tea service of the year, and Maui Matsuri demonstration.
