Dear parents and guardians of the Hermann School,

In order to provide you with the best possible transparency, I would like to explain the following chart, which was made available to us by the Ministry, in more detail.

NEU: Führt ein Pooltest zum positiven Ergebnis, werden ab dem folgenden Tag die betreffenden Schülerinnen und Schüler in der Schule vor Unterrichtsbeginn ausschließlich mit Antigen-Schnelltests getestet. Alternativ kann auch ein zertifizierter Antigen-Schnelltest (kostenfreier Bürgertest) oder anderweitig eingeholter PCR-Test vorgelegt werden. Der Wechsel zurück vom Antigen-Schnelltest zum PCR-Pooltest erfolgt beim nächsten negativen Pooltestergebnis.

All children of the Hermann School are tested on Monday and Wednesday by Iollipop test (pool test).

On the respective evening, I as the head teacher receive binding information from the laboratory by 8:30 p.m. at the latest as to which class / learning group has a positive and / or negative pool.

The following scenarios are possible:

1. the pool test of a learning group / class is negative

This means that no child within this group is infected with the coronavirus. Normal lessons take place the following day.

Neither you as guardians / parents nor we, on the part of the school, have to subject the children of this negatively tested learning group / class to a citizenship test / rapid test.

Everything goes its "normal" course.

2. the pool test of a learning group / class is positive

This means that within this positive pool at least one child is infected with the coronavirus.

Again, as the head teacher, I am notified by 8:30 pm.

I then inform the respective class teacher immediately.

The class teacher of your class / learning group will then contact you immediately.

In our experience, it has also proved extremely helpful within the last week if you have a "WhatsApp group" or similar within your learning group / class. This way you as parents can network well and pass on this information accordingly. In this way, parents can also be reached whom we cannot inform immediately by telephone.

On the following day, your child will either be tested by you at an official testing centre or at school.

If you take your child to such a test centre, we will need to receive the result by email hermannschule@stadt-muenster.de; regardless of whether your child has tested negative or positive.

If your child tests POSITIVE for the coronavirus after the rapid test at an official testing centre, please take your child to home isolation and also report the result to us.

If your child has a positive rapid test at school, we will contact you immediately and you must collect your child IMMEDIATELY and take another test at an official testing centre.

In our experience, it seems that if we test that your child has had a positive rapid test at school, you will get a PCR test for your child. However, this finding in the last few days is "without guarantee".

Ultimately, testing will continue in the class with a positive pool result, also in the course of the following days, until the pool of the respective learning group / class, is negative again.

Until this point, the children must be tested daily either by a rapid test at an official testing station or by us at school.

Please print out the test results of a citizenship test and give them to your child to take to school or send them directly after you have received them by e-mail to hermannschule@stadt-muenster.de.

Hopefully I have been able to give you a good overview of the current procedure. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to contact us at any time.
