Dear Rotary Frankston Sunrise,

Welcome to DOVES and thanks for your \$510 sponsorship of six children. You will be pleased to know that the vast majority of sponsorship monies paid go directly to supporting the children to whom we provide sponsorship.

At times we have helped with special projects, where we will try and secure money, so they can become a reality, this is through corporate and sponsors donations. In Da Lat in 2016 we replaced a roof and repainted the orphanage. Tiled the kitchen and TV area so the children had a clean area to sit and play. We raised \$5500.00 to complete this project. I was on site with my interpreter to make the payment and ensure work was carried out properly. We also raised money to re tile the kitchen and bedrooms. A sun cover over the children's play area was also completed through DOVES donations. This donation came from the people on a sponsors tour.

DOVES is a not-for-profit organisation & registered as a Charity. The Concept for this organisation was started by a Vietnam Veteran by the name of Dennis Edwards. During his time in Vietnam, he and a group of engineers from the 106 Field Workshops, built some playground equipment for a government run orphanage.

Dennis returned to Vietnam 43 years later, to discover the equipment was still being used (as it is today). From that day Dennis started helping, first with food, then he started paying to send some children to school through a family fund. Our organisation has undergone a rebranding to reflect the breath of the fund we are running today. You will find all these details on our web site. www.doves.org.au

DOVES now sponsor 203 children, with 93 sponsors. We support these children through seven centres. Our main aim is to provide the funds to see that the child gets a valuable chance at a basic education. This, of course, is an education they may not have received if it wasn't for your sponsorships like this.

The SkyHydrant is a lightweight (18 kg) water filter, portable and easy to deploy in the field, that produces safe drinking water without the need for power or chemicals

Disaster Aid Australia uses SkyHydrants purchased from the 'not for profit' SkyJuice Foundation to bring safe, clean, drinking water to communities in many countries that need safe drinking water.

Over the past 18 months, the FHS Interact students have worked hard at raising the \$5500 needed to purchase the SkyHydrant and their hard work has finally paid off.

For the next 10 years and beyond, the SkyHydrant will provide access to clean drinking water for 800 children and staff at the school.

Congratulations to everyone involved...it's an amazing outcome and one we can all feel very proud of.


