As part of an application process for the Foreign Ministry of a country of your choosing (please indicate the country chosen), ideally one of your preferred countries for the Model NATO Germany 2023, you are asked to evaluate the nature of one of NATO's current or historic missions and operations and discuss its involvement in the area it was operating within in terms of crisis management beyond traditional defense and military operations.

You are a member of a NATO team responsible for overseeing the development on NATO's eastern border. Chose an area of possible future conflict and outline harmful developments paying special attention to the consequences for civil society. Additionally, provide preventative policies and measures available to NATO based on feasibility. The results should be presented in the format of a policy memo to be presented to higher-ups within your NATO team.

As part of NATO's Military Committee you are responsible for translating NATO's political goals and strategies into directions for military action. In doing so, you concern yourself with the question on how these goals could be achieved or implemented through military cooperation or involvement. Develop and outline a concept for future military cooperation between NATO and non-member states in current, recent, or expected turmoil (e.g. Georgia/Moldova/etc.) that reflects the current political landscape and aims. The results should be presented in the format of a policy memo to be presented to higher-ups within your NATO team.



Model NATO Germany

For an upcoming event in a non-member country of your choosing you are tasked with writing a speech explaining the significance of NATO's partnerships with non-member states in enhancing global security. Analyze the benefits and risks associated with these partnerships and give recommendations for strengthening NATO's collaborative efforts. If relevant, mention the chosen country and event.

The recent joining of Finland + (Sweden) to NATO is the latest enlargement of the Alliance. As an employee of the NATO Diplomacy Division, you are preparing a talk to university students on the topic. Write a speech that analyzes the implications of NATO's enlargement and the joining of new member states. Focus also on the benefits and challenges associated with an expansion and discuss their impact on regional stability.

You are a member of the NATO team responsible for drafting the organization's strategic concept. Write a position paper outlining your vision for NATO's role in international security in relation to other alliances and powers in the next ten years. In your paper, address challenges facing the alliance and outline specific steps NATO should take to address them.

Discuss the – in your opinion – three greatest challenges NATO faces as a military alliance in the 21st century in the following table. We suggest showcasing the challenges along the proposed PMESII dimensions as shown below and add up to three additional dimensions of your choosing. After completing the table, pick one cell of your choosing and expand on the bullet points listed in them.
